Today on the show I get to talk with my friend Keatyn Swift Wright aka Keatyn Klaus. She's Nashville-based holiday decorator to the stars. She's been bringing her cozy and sentimental design aesthetic to homes all over. Delighting her clients by selling their homes for the holidays since 2017. She's here to share her decorating tips and tricks with us. It is a bougie conversation and I am here for it. So let's meander over to the entryway Christmas tree and chat with my friend Keatyn Klaus.

Annie: Okay, Keatyn, we're jumping right in where we just started. You're telling me that you

have clients who start thinking about and ordering for their Christmas decor in April?

**Keatyn:** April.

**Annie:** What?

**Keatyn:** Well, mainly because on Instagram, obviously, this is the time of year people reach out,

they say "Go follow Keatyn." And then they all come to me and then they're like, "Can I hire you now?" And I'm like, "No." Because there's just not enough time to adequately

design, and then order, and receive.

Annie: Right.

**Keatyn:** So I always do a really big push in January and say if you're really interested, then you

need to reach out to me in the spring, and luckily, that's what a lot of people do.

**Annie:** And people do.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Oh my gosh. Okay, so even speaking of this year, I mean, everybody's talking about the

delay in ordering things.

**Keatyn:** Oh, yeah.

**Annie:** Are you experiencing that with some of your decor or was it already handled? I mean it's

not even a handling thing, like What Sounds Fun to You the book, we couldn't get as

many as we needed the first week.

**Keatyn:** I can't even imagine.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Well, it kind of goes back in like, I'm sure you feel the same way. I get so nervous, I'm

like, if I say this date, then people are going to hold you to that and that stresses me out.

Annie: Yes.

**Keatyn:** So I basically just enter all my contracts, but hey, I have no control over the shipping.

**Annie:** Yeah, very smart.

**Annie:** I'm going to do everything I can and luckily, fingers crossed, everything arrived last week

that I ordered in June.

**Annie:** Oh, my gosh! Do you have a storage unit? Where do you put it all? You have to, yeah.

**Keatyn:** I do. I have four units that

Annie: Oh, you have four units, I love your life so much. I can't wait for people to hear about all

of this. We're jumping in the middle but we're about to back up to the beginning. You

have four storage units full of Christmas decorations?

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Oh, my gosh!

**Keatyn:** Yeah. It keeps growing.

**Annie:** So when do you start actually showing up in people's homes?

**Keatyn:** Gosh, it depends on the client. But I would say, so we do October is become a big thing.

**Annie:** Okay, so you start with Halloween?

**Keatyn:** Yes.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** So when I first started the company, it was solely Christmas.

**Annie:** I thought it was solely Christmas, no.

**Keatyn:** And it was just Keaton Claus then, that was in 2017. And then in '18 I dropped a holiday

company under it.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** So that kind of broadened across all spectrums and then October hit and people were like,

"Can you do the front porches?" And we did. So I've been doing October all month and then into November I have about one week, first week of November, where I don't decorate, but I'm making sure everything has, check it twice type of thing. And then we

start decorating the second week in November.

**Annie:** Oh, my gracious.

**Keatyn:** And it goes through, I am actually full capacity through December 16th.

**Annie:** Oh my gosh, there are people who are going to wait and get things on December 16th?

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Oh, my gosh! You do insides and outsides?

**Keatyn:** I have a really good vendor that does exterior lighting.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Because of the liability.

**Annie:** Yeah, certainly.

**Keatyn:** Not my thing.

Annie: No, no.

**Keatyn:** So I try to stick to interior, but if it's like live garland will, obviously hang that outside.

**Annie:** Okay, back us all the way up. Were you like the kid who loved Christmas?

**Keatyn:** I was. But I will tell you I'd never, I feel like a lot of people say this, one, I never wanted

to be an entrepreneur.

Annie: Uh-huh.

**Keatyn:** Ever.

Annie: Right. Well, people don't know what we're signing up for when you sign up for this.

**Keatyn:** Never. I personally I love a good paycheck that I know is coming.

**Annie:** I love a good paycheck if someone else signs, I did not know how much I love that.

**Keatyn:** So truly, that was never in the jigsaw puzzle.

Annie: Right.

**Keatyn:** But I always loved Christmas. I was a December baby, December 11th, And then I

worked for a photographer forever while I was in Kentucky and we did her set designs

and things. So if I go like look at the life map if I stand above and look at it.

**Annie:** Mh-hmm.

**Keatyn:** Then I can see how God got me to this.

**Annie:** Certainly.

**Keatyn:** For sure, it's definitely His plan, I'm just living it.

Annie: Yeah. Tell me why it feels, well, let me start by saying I totally agree with you. I think

you're doing a thing that God puts you on the planet to do.

**Keatyn:** Thank you.

**Annie:** Why is it a gospel work to decorate people's homes?

**Keatyn:** Okay, I think a lot of people don't get joy from it, whatsoever.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** And that's fine, that's why God created me. I am a Two on the Enneagram.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** So I know-

**Annie:** What's Nick's? What's your husband's?

**Keatyn:** He is a Two Wing Six-

**Annie:** You got to wing him beside you. So the three one or three? Okay. The two was okay.

Yeah, yes. That seems very true. Yes.

**Keatyn:** He's a Two though, which is funny so we're both helpers.

**Annie:** Yeah, both Twos.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** How happy your home must be, no problems at all.

**Keatyn:** Yeah, it's like who's going to really help, because we think all right, always right, right?

**Annie:** Yeah, yeah.

**Keatyn:** And then you add our last name being Wright-

**Annie:** Oh, that's right.

**Keatyn:** So, I'm a two on the Enneagram which, again, becoming an entrepreneur, to me, that is

not a very Two thing to do.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Because you're the helper, but I think God just kind of twisted it and I created a company

where I am the help.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** And so that was the only way for me to do it.

**Annie:** Yeah, that's wild. So you're just living into how God made you?

**Keatyn:** 100% I was supposed to be a servant.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Wow.

**Keatyn:** There's no way to slice it because every career that I look back on, I was always the

servant doing things and that's fine. That's just where I find my joy.

**Annie:** What's your favorite part of it? Is it the actual decorating? Is it the designing? Is it the

being in people's homes? What do you love the most about it? I was about to assume, I started by saying, "I bet you really love it." I'm like, "Well, I don't know." I want you to

tell me what love?

**Keatyn:** I do love when I get to the end of a project and then I go back to the next year and I see

how fluid it is. That gives me a lot of joy because I think it takes a special mind to be like

start to finish this will calculate itself a certain way.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Instead of like I know from start to finish how to decorate a tree, with my eyes closed.

**Annie:** Right.

**Keatyn:** But I don't know, that's a twisted question, the twist went into that I guess. I don't know. I

don't know.

**Annie:** I like it. While we're here, I feel a lot of pressure to have a

Christmas tree-

**Keatyn:** Don't we all even myself.

**Annie:** Yes, thank you. So a lot of pressure to have a Christmas tree that is full of the same color

ornament?

**Keatyn:** No, ma'am.

**Annie:** And yet I have all my ornaments collected and I love them.

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** So what do we need to do? How do we decorate a tree? Is there a right way?

**Keatyn:** I believe there is.

**Annie:** Okay.

**Keatyn:** And it's really simple.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** People make it a lot harder.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** I'm sure you have a certain, is your house pretty neutral?

Annie: Yes.

**Keatyn:** Okay.

**Annie:** Grays, and whites, and like-

**Keatyn:** I would actually recommend that you have some kind of pop of color on your tree.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Because you're not going to notice it right. So you can start with that base color that your

neutral palette stands on. So maybe have really large circular ornaments that are white or

grays.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** And then on the tips of the limbs is where you would hang all of your oddments.

**Annie:** Where do you put the white and gray ones? Would you tuck them in a little bit more?

**Keatyn:** You tuck them in. But when you're standing back and you like, I always say squint your

eyes and see where the lights aren't, that's where you put those large ornaments.

**Annie:** Oh, when you kind of tuck them in?

**Keatyn:** Mh-hmm.

**Annie:** And then you hang the ones that matter to you out on the edge.

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** Okay. Ribbon? Are we a ribbon person?

**Keatyn:** I love a good ribbon. I have a couple of clients that like me to do it around the tree like

wrap the tree. That is actually, even for myself, the hardest thing to do because no branch is exactly the same. So I like to weave in and out like you would see, and I actually start

from the top and go down.

**Annie:** Okay, start at the top and go down. Trees that are live or fake? Do you care?

**Keatyn:** I don't care. I mean, I love the smell of vines but I also hate spiders and they are all in

those.

**Annie:** That's right. That's right.

**Keatyn:** It's true.

**Annie:** And my fake one already has the lights on it.

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** It's just done.

**Keatyn:** But, this is a trick that I will tell you.

**Annie:** Oh, great that's why you're here.

**Keatyn:** Never buy pre-lit because they're-

**Annie:** Oops-Daisy!

**Keatyn:** ...they're going to die.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Like it's just inevitable. So if I can convince my clients to let me just buy unlit trees and

then let me wrap the meteor that's what I prefer.

Annie: Oh, okay.

**Keatyn:** I have a lot that won't let me, I want-

**Annie:** Unlit purchase and just wrap new lights on it.

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** I do add more lights, is that okay?

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** I just like it to be very twinkling.

**Keatyn:** I love the big lights.

**Annie:** Yes. Oh, you like the real big ones?

**Keatyn:** Oh, I love the big lights, but also just as many lights as you can get.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** I think the strands that I buy when I do light them they're 500 on a strand and I can link

seven together. Because you know there's a rule you have to have, it'll blow them all if

you keep lighting.

**Annie:** Oh, really? So there's a limit to how many you can plug.

**Keatyn:** Yeah, they'll eventually burn.

**Annie:** Oh, I didn't know that. See there's a rule, so seven is the most strands of lights-

**Keatyn:** Depends on the box, but it'll say on the box strand how many you can link of that specific

brand.

**Annie:** Keatyn, this is already worth the price of admission. Well done. I did not

know there was a limit-

**Keatyn:** There is a limit.

**Annie:** ...of how many you could link.

**Keatyn:** And always get a surge protector.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Because if you've got more lights on then it's going to bust if your power goes out.

**Annie:** Yeah, there's a world where that's happened in my house.

**Keatyn:** Is it?

**Annie:** Yeah, because I just plug it right into the wall and that's stupid. So I need to-

**Keatyn:** It's really inexpensive to buy surge protector.

Annie: Certainly. Yes, 100%. Trust me, it's not that I didn't have \$4 that day, I just was dumb, it

was not my lack that day. Okay, so back us up again to how you started this? I mean, the

first house you said I guess pay me to do this, how did you even start?

**Keatyn:** No, well, the funniest way to explain this as I saw a problem and a creative solution. And

the truth is like everyone is so stressed out or on holiday. So I just was like how can I help

that and here we are.

But the reality of how it started, I have a truly dear friend who is a professional model, and she asked me to decorate her house for the holidays. Because she was out of the

country and coming back home, so she was not here, had nothing here in Nashville.

**Annie:** And just you know you are such a good decorator, please settle this.

**Keatyn:** Yeah. Well, she also loves, she's Danish, so she loves Christmas and knows how much I

did, we're friends. So I was like, "You know what, okay, I will." And then the second she posted on Instagram it lit like wildfire. I actually have to hold her responsible for helping with the name because Klaus, K-L-A-U-S is Danish for Santa Claus. It's how they spell

Claus.

**Annie:** Oh, it's how they spell Klaus for Santa Claus. Brilliant.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

Annie: And so then people just started following you and suddenly-

**Keatyn:** People started like what? I need this. Because, and, you know Nick, the irony of that, my

husband's name is Nick, I think he thought I was crazy.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** When I said, "I think this is a thing." He's like, "No, no, I don't think it is, there's not

enough, no." And I'm like, "Yeah, I think there is." And then it just has grown to strengths

that I'd never imagined.

**Annie:** I mean, most houses you're doing multiple trees, in multiple rooms?

**Keatyn:** Multiple trees. And I now we're at two days. So like, that's the best part about the

business, that, again, is totally God's plan. Because if you'd have told me, in 2017, I could

have done this for a living I would have personally laughed in your face.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** But it's reoccurring clients every year, that they're like, "I can't live without this service."

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** They see how much joy they get to have during the season by simply just taking that one

thing off their plate.

**Annie:** Off their plate, right.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** So for all of our friends listening we'll link to you and stuff, but remember April-

**Keatyn:** April, yes, don't call me this year, please.

**Annie:** That's right. And, but, you're only in Nashville right?

**Keatyn:** I am right now. Honestly, the pandemic shifted some things.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** We were en route to doing some, Austin is a big, people are really pushing me to do that

and I have quite a few that I just stay in contact with. They're like, "The second, you'll

pull the trigger." So that's definitely going to be in the works. I'm just-

Annie: How many elves do you have working for you this Christmas? How many people are

helping you?

**Keatyn:** I have five this year.

**Keatyn:** Oh my gosh! And y'all do two installs a day?

**Keatyn:** Pretty much.

**Annie:** Oh, my gosh!

**Keatyn:** It sounds around the clock.

**Annie:** So there's a family who you're helping them decorate this year.

**Keatyn:** Mh-hmm.

**Annie:** You do all their stuff and then do you take that stuff back to your storage unit? Is it yours?

**Keatyn:** They can pay a fee for that I re-store it. The majority of my clients have storage spaces.

**Annie:** Got it.

**Keatyn:** So we typically just store on site, which is nice.

Annie: Okay. So you get there and you go, "Give me the key to your storage unit." Y'all go get

everything from the storage unit or wherever it is, upstairs, downstairs, down the street.

**Keatyn:** Yep.

**Annie:** You bring it in and you just decorate it?

**Keatyn:** They do not touch a thing it's very white glove. And it can start, like I said, some of them

just-

**Annie:** This is a wild job you have.

**Keatyn:** ...some of them just want to use the decor that they already have, which is fine.

**Annie:** They just want someone else to do it, because they don't have time, they're on the road or

something.

**Keatyn:** Yeah. And that's called "Your Decor Our Design" that's on our website, Service tab. But a

lot, I mean the majority of my clients, I have weaned through all of their things in April. And then we start from scratch and design, and order, and bring it all, install, and then by

the next year it's just so-

Annie: Brand new clients, you go in and look at everything they have and you say, "We got to

get rid of this, this, and this. This is old, this is working blah, blah."

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** "Now, let's dream up what your house could look like."

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** I bet when people move they call you a lot-

**Keatyn:** Absolutely.

**Annie:** ...because it's a new location?

**Keatyn:** Mh-hmm.

**Annie:** Right. And they're like I don't know where the tree goes here?

**Keatyn:** Yeah, yeah.

Annie: Hey friends, just interrupting this conversation real quick to share about another one of

our incredible partners, Mercy Project. Most of us know that human trafficking is a big

problem around the world but not all trafficking is the same.

We mentioned a more localized version earlier, but in Ghana, Africa, for example, thousands of children are trapped in labor trafficking in the fishing trade for 12 long hours a day. These children come from poor families who, in financial desperation, have sold their child to a fisherman in hopes the child could live another day. Sadly, many of

the fishermen were once trafficked children themselves.

11 years ago, our partner Mercy Project started addressing the issue of child trafficking in creative ways and it's working. They formed village partnerships with the fishermen to literally teach a better way to fish, that makes them more money and replaces the need for child labor. This allows the children to be voluntarily released and reunited with their

families.

Over the last decade, more than 200 children have gone home to live with their families. This is a small but mighty nonprofit that is creating generational transformation in Ghana.

But that's where they need our help. There are currently 50 formerly trafficked children needing a sponsor. For \$45 a month you can empower a formerly trafficked child to receive education and experience freedom. And this month Mercy Project will randomly select a new child sponsor to travel to Ghana with their team in 2022, all expenses paid. Meet your sponsor child and their family. See the project firsthand, and experience the beauty of Ghana.

stressed out when I get there because I haven't designed it.

Annie: Right.

**Keatyn:** And not that I care what it looks like ultimately, because I always say, "Your house your

rules."

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** I'm like, "What if the lights don't work perfect?" Like I get it, I can fix or repair whatever

our sources have done but anyway-

**Annie:** What's your favorite room to do in people's homes?

**Keatyn:** I would say the entry, probably.

**Annie:** Really?

**Keatyn:** Just because that's mainly the focal point, for most of my clients, is whoever's walking

through the door.

Annie: Okay, so y'all do-

**Keatyn:** Yeah, those are the bigger trees that I do.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** I just need to remind you that I have a condo. So when you are saying entry, I was

thinking, "Oh, yeah that will look cute if I did something there." And then you said, "That's where the biggest tree is." I was like, "Not, that's not my story." That is not my story everybody, sorry. Keatyn, I just love what you do so much. Okay, so when you are,

this year particularly, when we're talking about decorating.

**Keatyn:** Mh-hmm.

**Annie:** Is there colors that are like trendy? Do you get like an email that comes straight to-

**Keatyn:** From Santa?

Annie: ....Keatyn Klaus, that says, "Here's what the 2021 trendy Christmas decor is?"

**Keatyn:** I do not, but I do go to market every January.

**Annie:** Oh my gosh! In Atlanta or Dallas?

**Keatyn:** Mh-hmm. Atlanta.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** I live for it. You would think by the end of it I'd be like, "By December I'd be like never,

no more ornaments." But no it's a dream.

**Annie:** And at the market they have all their Christmas stuff in January?

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Wow. So that's wild to think about.

**Keatyn:** And then you can go back in the spring, but I typically just place all orders in January,

just because I have been in the houses at that point. But I don't get a specific color. You can kind of just see what's trending while you're there, but I would say we're in the South.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** So it's a staple that everything's pretty neutral or has that pop of red velvet, the classic

Christmas. No one goes super, I feel like if I went to L.A. they'd be like, "Let's do these copper colors" really kind of make it different, but I just don't think that's my market.

**Annie:** Yeah, okay, red velvet.

**Keatyn:** Red velvet.

**Annie:** But also copper is beautiful.

**Keatyn:** Copper is beautiful. I actually have people will see it on Instagram, we wrap gifts really

detailed.

Annie: Uh-huh.

**Keatyn:** And I have a copper ribbon that is velvet and it's so luscious. Love it. Love it.

**Annie:** I didn't know you have the gift wrapping too?

**Keatyn:** We do.

**Annie:** You're like a one-stop shop if someone needs help at Christmas?

**Keatyn:** If it falls under the North Pole, we do it. Just go to the service tab.

**Annie:** Yeah, we can handle it. Okay, so for our friends who don't live in Nashville that can't

bring you in today.

**Keatyn:** We've real options for them?

**Annie:** You do.

**Keatyn:** We do.

**Annie:** What do you do? Can you like do over the phone kind of thing?

**Keatyn:** We do. I do lots of virtual consultations so they just pay a flat fee. And then we FaceTime

in and it's a one-on-one with me and we walk through their house, and look at their

decorations and then I tell them where to start where to buy all the things.

**Annie:** Where do you love to go buy ornaments and Christmas decor?

**Keatyn:** If I'm telling someone to go to like a brick or mortar store. I mean, it's really hard to say

but like it depends on the price point.

Annie: Sure.

**Keatyn:** If you're wanting a higher end then I would typically say go to a Macy's or something like

that.

Annie: Oh, okay.

**Keatyn:** The problem is they put up their decor so late, that I can't do that research before I have

that phone call.

Annie: Right, that's right because you're having those phone calls in October and you don't know

what Macy's is going to have.

**Keatyn:** Exactly.

**Annie:** Because they don't come up till November or whatever, interesting.

**Keatyn:** So just because if-

**Annie:** Macy's is top end, that's where you send people?

**Keatyn:** I would think so.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Yeah, for the brick and mortar stores.

Annie: Yeah, yeah.

**Keatyn:** Everything we order is vendor from market, so it always makes me really sad. Eventually

we will have a sale page where people can buy all that stuff.

Annie: Please do.

**Keatyn:** But TBD.

**Annie:** Okay, so the budget level below Macy's, Target?

**Keatyn:** Target.

**Annie:** Okay. That is where I get the most of this.

**Keatyn:** I love Target. I would say hobby lobby but it's hit or miss.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Those are probably, honestly, Walmart has some really good options this year. So if

anyone is listening, if they still have any, run to Walmart.

**Annie:** When do you start looking at websites and going into brick and mortar, and thinking

about that?

**Keatyn:** I start I mean, if I went back to my camera roll right now you'd laugh. But I would say

October, early October. I started taking photos thinking like, "What am I going to tell

people?"

**Annie:** I mean you're literally working on this year round?

**Keatyn:** It's year round?

**Annie:** I don't know if you realize that?

**Keatyn:** No, it is year round.

**Annie:** It is literally year round that you are thinking about Christmas decor and people's homes.

Do you do your own house?

**Keatyn:** I do. But it's last and Nick is like this is ridiculous.

**Annie:** December 17th is your house?

**Keatyn:** But it's okay, because it just happens.

**Annie:** Do you use, like when you're thinking about your own house, are you pulling stuff out

that you have in storage? Or are you going, "Oh man, I love that look in that house we

did, I'm going to use some of that?"

**Keatyn:** I will say this is the first year, I've had the same tree for like five years.

Annie: Uh-huh.

**Keatyn:** I bought my own really nice tree this year and I cannot wait to put it up. Nick was like, "I

think this is time. It's time for Keatyn Claus to have the tree she wants."

Annie: Yes.

**Keatyn:** So I did buy that. He's really, really pressuring me because of Castle to do all of the

one-off ornaments. So I think we're going to start that tradition this year.

**Annie:** Oh, sweet. And how old is Castle?

**Keatyn:** He is eight months.

Annie: Yes.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** My gosh!

**Keatyn:** I know.

**Annie:** I saw he's the background on Nick's phone.

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** And I was like, "That baby is so cute."

**Keatyn:** I'm partial, yeah, and sweet.

**Annie:** Yeah, I mean, this will be your first Christmas with him, right?

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** I'm doing my math in my head.

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** That's awesome. But, though, he will grow up with Christmas 24/7.

**Keatyn:** He will. I'm like, "Do I make him think..." I don't know, I really hope he likes Santa.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** We're really screwed if he doesn't.

Annie: Right.

**Keatyn:** We're really screwed.

**Annie:** Okay, let's walk through the house, in our minds, can you give us some tips for a couple

of different rooms?

**Keatyn:** Sure.

**Annie:** So for example, in the kitchen, what's one thing you would like tell people to do in their

kitchen decoration wise?

**Keatyn:** I like to put a wreath right behind the stove, if there's a spot, and I think suction cups so

usually they'll stick to tile.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** So I would pop a wreath there. Obviously, don't leave the burner on while that's there in

case it drops.

Annie: Right.

**Keatyn:** But it's beautiful to just walk in your kitchen and see that one statement piece.

**Annie:** Are you a real wreath person or a fake wreath person, or do you care?

**Keatyn:** In my house we're fake because of Nick's allergies.

**Annie:** Oh, there you go.

**Keatyn:** And also they are very messy. Outside-

**Annie:** Yeah, they drop so much.

**Keatyn:** Outside, we are all live everything.

**Annie:** I'm picturing, I've never done a wreath over my stove so I'm going to do it this year.

**Keatyn:** Great, you just send me a picture.

**Annie:** I will. And I'm thinking, man, if I did a real one and then all those needles dropped

behind my stove?

**Keatyn:** Could you imagine?

**Annie:** What a fail, what a fail.

**Keatyn:** Nobody wants to pull the stove out.

Annie: Nobody wants to move a stove out just to get pine needles. Oh my gosh, that feels like,

for real, you've been cursed, if that happens. Guest bathrooms? What are we doing in

guest bathrooms?

**Keatyn:** I think the soaps that smell like pine are good little touch. I don't go crazy. Also putting a

wreath dead center of the mirror.

**Annie:** Oh, really?

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Dead center of the mirror, and do you use the same kind of hook.

**Keatyn:** Yeah, suction cup.

Annie: You put a wreath dead center, I'm going to do it too. I'm going to do it too.

**Keatyn:** Fine.

Annie: Your two for two. You just get a little like Command strip kind of-

**Keatyn:** You can. But if you just type in suction cup, I guess it's glass suction cup and it has a little

hook on it, a little anchor and you just pop it on and off every year.

**Annie:** The center of the mirror. It doesn't stress people out?

**Keatyn:** I don't think so. I love it.

**Annie:** It's also the guest bathroom.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

Annie: You are not [Crosstalk 00:29:06]

**Keatyn:** You're not putting your makeup on in there?

**Annie:** Right, I'll have to be in the middle of the wreath. When is it the right time to get someone

to like help you with this? How do you know when you're like overwhelmed and that's

the thing you should pass off, is getting your house ready for Christmas?

**Keatyn:** At the end of that, let's just say this year because I obviously can't take clients this year. If

you're at the end of this year and you are like, "That blew by, I didn't enjoy any second of

it."

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** That's when you need to call me.

Annie: Yes.

**Keatyn:** Because any client will tell you that just taking the front game and the end game off of

your list. I mean-

**Annie:** Y'all do the cleanup too?

**Keatyn:** Oh, yeah.

**Annie:** Dude, y'all do the clean up?

**Keatyn:** Yes, full service.

**Annie:** Very interesting.

**Keatyn:** It's full service. It's great. That is, by far, my clients favorite part. Nobody wants cleanup,

even myself I don't love it. But I will say it goes a lot faster because we know it's up and then by the next year, I would say the process the next year the clients really see holy

wow.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** This is a game changer because we're in and out.

**Annie:** Yes. So when do y'all start that, January?

**Keatyn:** I think my first removable starts, because a client of mine her husband's birthday is on the

31st we take it down the 29th.

**Annie:** Oh, my gosh.

**Keatyn:** But then I let my team, because I think it's very important after our season, we don't start

removals until I think it's the 5th January.

**Annie:** So it's like, "Hey, if you're with us, if we're decorating for you, we'll be there by the 5th.

**Keatyn:** Truly though, if you're hiring me then you love Christmas.

**Annie:** Yes, that's right. That's right.

**Keatyn:** So I think that-

**Annie:** You are not a casual Christmas person. That's exactly right.

**Keatyn:** No, you're not a casual Christmas person.

**Annie:** Do you have a like, my mother always says, "Christmas goes up after Thanksgiving

comes down before New Year's." Do you have rules-

**Keatyn:** Really?

Annie: Yeah, she's means it. I am not that way, when we're recording this, I'm putting mine up

this weekend.

**Keatyn:** Okay.

**Annie:** Because I'm like, ready. I'm just ready. It's cold, it's dark-

**Keatyn:** Yeah, it brings you brightness.

Annie: That's right. I just like it and I have to travel some coming up and so I'm going to lose

days with the decorations. So do you have a window of when like, is there like an

appropriate window of holiday decor?

**Keatyn:** Everyone thinks that your guests, at Thanksgiving, are going to be offended if your decor

is up and that is so far from untrue. I actually believe that in the long form, your guests

feel like you went overboard for them that Thanksgiving.

Annie: Sure.

**Keatyn:** Because, typically, or it is in my family, that's different sides of the family. So you give as

much effort to Thanksgiving as you did to Christmas.

**Annie:** And normally decorating for Thanksgiving is like the table.

**Keatyn:** Right.

**Annie:** And that's it.

**Keatyn:** Right.

**Annie:** Whereas the Christmas decorating is the actual whole house.

**Keatyn:** Totally.

**Annie:** Do you decorate in y'all's bedroom? Do you get every room in your house?

**Keatyn:** No.

**Annie:** Okay. Do most your clients do most rooms in their house or just the main, most-

**Keatyn:** No, I would say typically, it's kitchen, living, and a child's room.

**Annie:** Oh, yeah, doing cute little stuff in the kids' rooms. Kids having their own trees?

**Keatyn:** Mm-hmm.

**Annie:** That's a cute thing, right?

**Keatyn:** It is a cute thing.

**Annie:** Do most kids you know do that? We didn't do that when I was little.

**Keatyn:** I did that as a kid.

**Annie:** Did you?

**Keatyn:** I think my mom had, both my brother and I, we had like \$15 trees just those tiny little one

footers.

**Annie:** My friend Danielle was the same, that was my only friend, we're all were like, "This as

amazing, Danielle has her own tree."

**Keatyn:** Yeah like mine fit on a tiny little stool, in like baby doll stool.

Annie: Yes.

**Keatyn:** Yep. But I loved it and I mean, they've obviously grown larger.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** This day and age kids have their own trees.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Seven footers, but I think it's cool. And it's a good way to keep your main tree, what the

mom wants it to be versus what the child wants it be?

**Annie:** Yes. We're getting our ornaments and we're going through them. Where do you suggest

people give them away or get rid of or do we do that when we're getting them out? Do we do it when we're cleaning up? When's the right time to kind of go through your stuff?

**Keatyn:** I would do it, if you are personally doing it, I would recommend doing it while you're

currently decorating. If you see something you don't like, then that is the time to donate it

because that is when people are looking for it.

**Annie:** Wow, right.

**Keatyn:** If you take it after the season, it's kind of just sitting there.

Annie: Right, if I go through mine this weekend, then I'm giving people plenty of time to get it

Annie: How long do you tell people to hang on to ornaments? Like last year I did a bunch of

different colored, like white kind of balls on the tree.

**Keatyn:** Two years, max.

**Annie:** Two years? That's it?

**Annie:** Keatyn, I knew you're going to say like that.

**Keatyn:** No, I am not a hoarder. I'm not a hoarder. I, 100% have an issue that if I am over

something I would probably throw out a whole room.

Annie: Uh-huh.

**Keatyn:** I have that issue.

**Annie:** And just start over.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Wow, okay, so two years max on your decorations that are not sentimental.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Keatyn:** No, I have quite a few clients that we do those on their buffet tables or anything like that,

and usually it's something that's passed down for family, which I think is so cool.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** So cool.

Annie: That's it, that's where I was going to go is, I guess, when you're decorating are they all

sometimes there with you, and you're, like hearing about everything?

**Keatyn:** Mh-hmm. Yeah.

**Keatyn:** It's really an insightful, personally, because sometimes it makes me think like, "Wait, why

didn't we do that?" Like I get a little jealous to be honest, because a lot of people have

really cool trends.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** What are you seeing this year on dining room tables? What's kind of the look?

**Keatyn:** I think simple on a dining room table, even if someone said that's not the case. I always

advise because there is nothing worse than serving on a table where nothing fits.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** So take a piece of garland, I do like to use live garland on a dining table because it's more

bendable than-

**Annie:** And it actually lays flat compared to-

**Keatyn:** It does lay flat than the artificial. So that and a couple of tapere candles and some tea

lights.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Pine cones those are free, that's my favorite free tip.

**Annie:** Really, do you just go out and like collect them?

**Keatyn:** I mean, obviously, just go to your yard don't go to the park or something, because I don't

want a call. And that's a great trick with kids too, I can't wait to do that with Castle. Go grab a bunch of pine cones, two paper plates, one with Elmer's glue one with faux snow.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Dip the pine cone in the glue and then dip it in the snow, and you have snowy pine cones.

**Annie:** How often are you making things like that, when you are decorating?

**Keatyn:** We do a lot. We do a lot of DIY.

**Annie:** Really?

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** What are the kind of things y'all are making this year?

**Keatyn:** This year I have because of the freight issue, things sitting on carriers I was only

available to get a lot of white, we do like seven or eight inch balls.

**Annie:** Oh, on trees? That big? Like that's basketball, small basketball size?

**Keatyn:** Yes.

**Annie:** Oh, Keatyn.

**Keatyn:** So some colors I can't get, and so I just bought a ton of white in all different sizes and

we're having to dip them in paint.

**Annie:** Oh, in whatever colors you need for the houses?

**Keatyn:** Yeah,

**Annie:** When you go in and design are there like three houses across Nashville that actually are

the same theme? Are you like, "Here is what I'm doing this year." Or is it all what the

client has to bring or is it mixed?

**Keatyn:** We design everything to that specific project.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Nothing is cookie-cutter.

Annie: Okay.

**Keatyn:** Yeah.

**Annie:** Cookie-cutter would be easier?

**Keatyn:** It will be.

**Annie:** You go like, "Here is what your house is going to look like this year. I've got all these

white balls."

**Keatyn:** It really would be.

**Annie:** I'm gonna dip them in green and that's it.

**Keatyn:** Yeah, it would be. I should just give, I should just do that but-

**Annie:** There's like a box option in the future?

**Keatyn:** In the future.

13-foot ladder that I need." So I have pretty much the majority of my clients, they will

allow-

**Annie:** Anti-topper.

**Keatyn:** Anti-topper.

Annie: So this is literally blown my mind. So instead, I mean, there's ornaments up there and

that's it.

**Keatyn:** I'm trying to make your life easier.

**Annie:** Yeah. There's ornaments up there and that's it. You just stop with the ornaments.

**Keatyn:** Stop with the ornaments.

**Annie:** And maybe ribbon if you're feeling ribbon?

**Keatyn:** You can put ribbon, sure.

**Annie:** But no ribbon bow at the top? Nothing at the top, nothing.

**Keatyn:** No, nothing it's a tree.

**Annie:** We're doing nothing at the top in 2021 it's a tree.

**Keatyn:** It's a tree.

**Annie:** It's a tree, trees don't have things at the top except other limbs.

**Keatyn:** Except the one tree, the one tree has the thing at the top.

**Annie:** Wow, wow, you've really done it, I'm shocked.

**Keatyn:** But the other thing that I do want other people to know that I know that others don't. All

this stress that we all put on ourselves to have all of this things everything perfect, look a certain way, buy this thing, buy that thing. None of it really matters when it comes to

Christmas. The material things are the material things.

**Annie:** Mh-hmm.

**Keatyn:** Kind of like I say with the topper, like story of Jesus is the main part.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** And we need to just remember that.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** And I think sometimes when we're all scrolling and looking at it, we're like, "Huh, I didn't

get that." I mean, I see it often in stores lately, I don't know if you have, where there'll be like you're not getting this until, and I'm like wow, we have forgotten what is the real truth here about Christmas. So if there's one thing I could tell everybody that I actually do

know and unfortunately it is material things are a part of my business, but that is

definitely not the reason for the season.

**Annie:** Do you decorate in ways that show the spiritual side of your service? What does that look

like?

**Keatyn:** For sure. I mean, I think it could be little things like you're saying the stable and all that.

Like I love when it's really hard sometimes for me to like bring that up in a conversation. So I love when clients like sit down and say this is, I do have a client that an angel on their tree is an absolute must and it's a meaning from their Christmas it's like their

grandmother's.

Annie: Yeah.

**Keatyn:** Totally going to do that.

**Annie:** Yes. On the top?

**Keatyn:** On the top.

**Annie:** Oh boy. Oopsy-Daisy.
